Dear Families,

This week in Spanish, students practiced greetings, personal information, colors, months of the year, and vocabulary related to Valentine’s Day. Below you will find all the phrases practiced in class, written in Spanish with the English translation for at-home support.

What We Practiced This Week

Greetings

- **Buenos días.** – Good morning.
- **Buenas tardes.** – Good afternoon.
- **Buenas noches.** – Good evening / Good night.

Talking About Age

- **¿Cuántos años tienes?** – How old are you?
- **Tengo 9 años.** – I am 9 years old.

Students practiced asking and answering using complete sentences.

Phone Number

- **¿Cuál es tu número de teléfono?** – What is your phone number?
- **Mi número de teléfono es (903) 738-1438.** – My phone number is (903) 738-1438.

Students practiced saying numbers clearly and confidently.



Colors

- **¿De qué color es el globo?** – What color is the balloon?
- **El globo es rojo.** – The balloon is red.
- **El globo es azul.** – The balloon is blue.
- **El globo es amarillo.** – The balloon is yellow.
- **El globo es verde.** – The balloon is green.

Months of the Year

- **Los meses del año.** – The months of the year.
- **¿En qué mes estamos?** – What month are we in?
- **Estamos en febrero.** – We are in February.

Celebrations in February

- **¿Qué celebramos en febrero?** – What do we celebrate in February?
- **Celebramos el Día de San Valentín.** – We celebrate Valentine’s Day.
- **¿Qué día se celebra?** – On what day is it celebrated?
- **El 14 de febrero.** – February 14th.

Introducing Yourself

- **¿Cómo te llamas?** – What is your name?
- **Me llamo Sandra.** – My name is Sandra.

Important grammar note:

“**Me llamo**” is a reflexive verb phrase, meaning “I call myself.”

In Spanish, you do not use “**es**” (is) when saying your name with *me llamo* because the phrase literally means “I call myself,” not “I am called.”

✗ **Incorrect:** *Me llamo es Sandra.*

(“I call myself is Sandra.” – grammatically incorrect)

✓ **Correct options:**

- **Me llamo Sandra.** – I call myself Sandra.
- **Soy Sandra.** – I am Sandra.
- **Mi nombre es Sandra.** – My name is Sandra.

Valentine’s Day Bingo Game

We played Valentine’s Day Bingo using the following vocabulary:

- **Rosa** – Pink
- **Flores** – Flowers
- **Corazón** – Heart
- **Chocolates** – Chocolates



- **Globo** – Balloon
- **Monstruo del amor** – Love monster
- **Bichito del amor** – Love bug
- **Amor** – Love
- **Dulces de corazones** – Conversation heart candies
- **Chocolate caliente** – Hot chocolate
- **Galleta** – Cookie
- **Flecha** – Arrow

Students practiced recognizing, pronouncing, and identifying these words while playing.

At-Home Practice Tips

Ask your child daily:

- **¿Cuántos años tienes?** – How old are you?
- **¿Cómo te llamas?** – What is your name?

Practice colors around the house:

- **¿De qué color es ___?** – What color is ___?

Review February celebration:

- **¿Qué celebramos en febrero?** – What do we celebrate in February?

Short daily practice (5 minutes) builds confidence and fluency!
